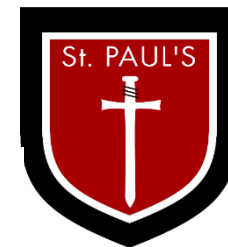
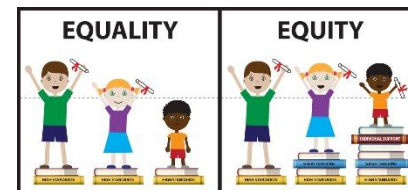


Pupil Equity Funding @ St. Paul's PS 2025-2026

What is the Pupil Equity Fund?

Pupil Equity Fund (PEF) is part of the Scottish Attainment Fund. Every local authority receives PEF. This funding is allocated directly to schools for making improvements in literacy, numeracy and health and wellbeing. For session 2025-2026, St. Paul's Primary School have been allocated £19,600. This will be used for staffing, resources, and wider experiences to target attainment and achievement across the following areas:



Learner Participation and Engagement

- Continued Parent Council support through Fundraising to subsidise pupil experiences and school resources
- PSW hours subsidised to provide additional pupil support
- Life skills group and curriculum for those learners who require a unique way to learn
- Nurture provision to support identified learners
- Continue to provide support/advice and appropriate referrals for identified families

Literacy and English

- Review of core literacy resources and purchasing of resources to meet the needs of learners with barriers to accessing literacy learning.
- Targeted supports for spelling for identified pupils through the implementation of 5/10 Minute boxes
- Targeted First Level reading/spelling for identified learners.

Health and Wellbeing

- Continue to engage with wider agencies to further develop learner participation and engagement.
- Regulation and Wellbeing groups for identified learners, to develop emotional literacy, and confidence and engagement in school.
- Further develop universal and targeted approaches to supporting attendance.
- Further develop the use of the Circle resource and implement an nurturing approach.

Numeracy and Maths

- Review of core numeracy resources and purchasing of resources to meet the needs of learners with barriers to accessing Numeracy
- Targeted supports through PSW input - small group focussed interventions
